

## Sport Premium at Wellington Primary School



The sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities we offer to our pupils.

Wellington receives PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils we have in years 1 to 6. We received funding amounting to £10,080 for the academic year of 2014 - 2015.

We have endeavoured to use our sport premium funding in a number of different ways:

- Hired specialist PE teachers to support staff with planning & teaching of P.E. (Clare King - Sport Impact)
- Hired qualified sports coaches to work with teachers (Simon Haughney & Paul Thomas)
- Provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport (Real PE scheme, Inset training x2)
- Supported and involved the least active children by running & extending school sports clubs and Change4Life clubs
- Run sport competitions & increased pupils' participation in the School Games
- Run sports activities with other schools



The sport premium money that we have received has been spent according to our needs, the needs that are specific to our children. We strongly believe that the way the funding has been allocated has had and will continue to have, a direct impact on our children at Wellington.

- Y2 Yew & Elm (planning & teaching of P.E., Clare King - Sport Impact)
- Y3 Beech (planning & teaching of P.E., Clare King - Sport Impact)
- Y5 Sycamore (planning & teaching of P.E., Clare King - Sport Impact)
- Change4Life - 20 targeted children to improve dietary habits, confidence & self-esteem issues
- Sports clubs - funding of places for vulnerable/in need children.
- Sport competitions - Brentford sports days, tennis, football, quad kids, sports hall athletics, cricket, netball
