Tuesday was dedicated to Science investigating for Year 6 Pupils. They were ecstatic to start an organised study of a lamb's heart and to experience their learning in a real life context. Year 6 has been focusing on The Circulatory System and how exercise affects the heart rate.

The hearts were opened and the various parts were located, **Christian** commented, *'I was exhilarated – it looks completely different to the diagrams.'* **Liba** went on to say, *'Very interesting to see the heart – the tubes weren't very visible. I never knew the heart strings were real.'* **Neha** also commented *'Exciting, gross and sticky!'*

How many ways can we look after our heart and make sure it is healthy, strong and functioning properly?

This week **Year 3** were exploring light and how it travelled through one object to another. They were using torches, mirrors and split card to make the light do all sorts of amazing things. We asked some children what they learnt....' *We got to use some different coloured torches to find out what light absorbed or reflected.'* (Lucas)
