Did you know..?

- More than 750 million people lack suitable drinking water
- 805 million people do not have enough food to eat

**FAIR TRADE** is a way of buying and selling products that allows the farmers to be paid a **fair** price for their produce, and have better working conditions. **Trade** is 'unfair' when farmers receive very low income and have poor conditions while the companies that sell their products make lots of money from them. **Please try to buy Fairtrade!**
