Why the 'fall armyworm' is a very big problem for farmers

Some parts of Africa are being affected by a pest known as the "fall armyworm". But it's not a worm, despite its name. It's actually a hungry caterpillar that is eating crops. It's a big problem for farmers because it is eating maize and other crops, which people depend on for food. What's making it worse, is that it is a new pest, so farmers and the government don't know how to get rid of it. Scientists are developing a new kind of pest spray to kill this creepy crawly.



UK scientists need your help spotting orcas

Every year pods of orcas make a journey from Iceland to Orkney and John O'Groats in Scotland. The underwater mammals migrate every year for food and it gives people the chance to spot them up close. Scientists want people to look out for the orcas, as they want to learn more about their migration patterns. Kathy James from the Sea Watch Foundation explains: "It's relatively easy to see land animals and the habitats they're using, but it's more difficult to see animals that live under the sea. The only way we can see where they are and what they're doing is if people report that to us."




Year Six Moderation!

Luxury Harbour Club gym opens in Kensington

A luxury gym has opened in the heart of Kensington, following a £5.5m refurbishment. The state of the art gym, in Cromwell Road, opened its doors Friday (June 2) and is the third club to join existing branches in Chelsea and Notting Hill. The Harbour Club shot to fame in the mid-1990s as the Chelsea club became a regular haunt for Princess Diana. The new club, which was previously a David Lloyd gym, is situated over five floors at Point West. It has seven group training areas including group fitness studios and a dedicated HIIT training area for Harbour Club's SYNRGY training sessions.





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Explore London Zoo by night




