Bumblebees' smelly feet trick

Scientists from the University of Bristol say that they've discovered a clever trick that bumblebees use to help each other find the best food. They leave "smelly footprints" behind on the plants that they've already eaten from, so that other bees know whether it's a good source of food. For example, the invisible, smelly markers can let other bees know if a flower is full of good food. Or it could signal that the food has already all been eaten. Researchers said that bees can also tell the difference between footprints left by themselves, their family, or strangers.



House becomes giant icicle

A house near a lake in New York in America became covered in ice. The strong winds and low temperatures caused water from Lake Ontario to blow over the house and then freeze. It is part of a winter storm that is expected to bring blizzard-like conditions from New York City to Boston this week. More than half a metre of snow is expected in some areas. The mayor of New York has called on people to stay indoors to stay safe.







London Paramount


Reading to help children in hospital
