
Penguins get special pipeline to help them cross roads

A town called Oamaru in New Zealand has built a 25 metre tunnel to help their local penguins pass the busy road between the sea and their nests. Penguins in the town are rare 'blue' penguins, the smallest kind in the world, and are an endangered species. To make the little creature's daily trek safe, the city of Oamaru started building an underpass for Penguins in September this year. The underpass which took around three weeks to build was opened earlier this month. And their care and attention is paying off - Oamaru's blue penguin colony is one of the few populations in the world that is actually growing.

More than 40,000 people from Hounslow and Ealing clocked up over 150,000 miles in a real-life health game - more than 170 times the distance between Land's End and John O'Groats. Residents, businesses, community groups and schools from both boroughs took part in the *Beat the Street* competition which saw pupils from a school in Hounslow crowned overall winners. St Michael and St Martin's RC Primary School in Hounslow managed to travel 11,000 miles by walking, running and cycling during the six-week contest, scooping the £1,000 Decathlon vouchers.




Santa and his grotto open in style at the Treaty Centre in Hounslow




