

The man who built his own giant robot to ride around in!



Earth day






Mo bikes


Have you noticed these orange bikes everywhere? If you were wondering what they are, they are called Mo bikes. A Mo-bike is a bike where you can pick up and leave a bike anywhere, and you don't have to worry. This bike has a very smart lock system, which only let you use the bike if you have the app. You need to download the app and scan the barcode on the bike and it will automatically unlock. The app has automatic payment for each hour, and is cheaper than bus or train. On the app you click on the "My Trip" option, and type in you route, and you will get a summary of the route.

UNICEF: Rights Respecting school







Yellow is 1st with 61 points, green is trailing behind with 57, blue is 3rd is with 55 points, and red is last with only 51 points.
