The adventurer set off from France, in July, on a mission to bike around the world in 80 days, and he arrived back in Paris on Monday evening, on day 79 of the journey. In order to complete the epic 18,000-mile challenge, Mark needed to cycle on average 240 miles a day!

## NSPCC appeal for Hounslow schools to get on board with free safeguarding assemblies for children

The NSPCC is appealing for schools in Hounslow to get on board with its "Speak Out Stay Safe" campaign, which is aimed at teaching children about the different forms of abuse. In 2016, the children's charity went into a number of schools across the borough, speaking in assemblies and delivering workshops to a total of 8,987 children, aged four to 11. During the talks, children are encouraged to speak out to a trusted adult or Childline if they are worried about abuse or neglect. The charity believes they could make a massive difference to the lives of children in the borough.




Hounslow makes a £2million splash to transform its leisure centres A huge £2million is being splashed out to spruce up pools and changing facilities at three venues in the borough, in a move to keep families active, fit and healthy. Residents are being invited to have their say on the plans put together by Hounslow Council and Fusion Lifestyle, which manages the leisure centers. It will feature a splash pad for safe water play and new starter blocks for competitive swimming. The investment will create a new tiled surround, plus a new pool lining and pool lane markings in the main pool.


