### Famous author



## Heathrow Airport expansion

The revised draft statement includes information on long-term aviation forecasts. Locals can put forward their opinions to new evidence in the government's revised draft Airport National Policy Statement which includes information on long-term aviation forecasts. The statement also sets out the impact of changes arising from updated noise analysis, a new air quality plan, government policy changes and responses to the first consultation. The consultation is open until December 19, so residents will have to ensure their views are submitted online before that date.




## Poppy Lines
