## **SEND Review Update**

#### Sarah Jones, SEND Link Governor reports following Hounslow Borough's SEND Panel Review

Hounslow Borough has set up a Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Mainstream Funding Task and Finish group to respond to the external review carried out by a consultant. This group looks at how we currently fund children with SEND in mainstream schools and settings and the options for a new mainstream High Needs funding model. The group comprises relevant Local Authority staff, Headteachers, Special Educational Needs Coordinators (SENCos) and a governor.



Hounslow has started to look at its local specialist provision to ensure this can meet the needs of pupils as far as possible within the Borough, with reduced reliance on placements in other Authority schools and in the independent/nonmaintained special school sector. Hounslow Borough is keen to look at how mainstream provision can be strengthened.

A new SEND Adviser has been appointed to the School Improvement Service to revitalize local training and networking opportunities. However, there is a need for a broader evaluation of how schools are currently resourced, both in terms of their use of delegated budgets (notional SEN) and their access to any additional funding and support. All access to additional funding in Hounslow mainstream schools is through the statutory process (through an Education, Health and Care i.e., EHC Needs Assessment). Hounslow is interested in exploring other models that could be more dynamic and less administratively demanding.

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In addition, an external consultant with extensive experience of strategic contributions in this area, having worked on mainstream support and funding issues with a wide range of Local Authorities (including a number of London Boroughs) as well as nationally, is also part of the working team named 'SEND Mainstream Funding Task & Finish Group' following the review.
