What have we been up to this week?

This week in Reception, we have had a wonderful time learning about Diwali. The children have been learning about the story of Rama and Sita, creating traditional Indian art and learning about the beautiful traditions. They have had a fantastic time creating salt dough and playdough divas and decorating them with colorful paint and gems. The children have also been using piping bags to create wonderful Mendi patterns on cardboard hands, taking their time to copy tradition designs and create their own unique patterns. In Phonics, we have been learning the sounds f, ff, l, ll and ss. The children have been practicing Green Froggy high frequency words like he, she and me. We are now using our phonic knowledge to write for a purpose; this week the children produced Diwali cards. In Maths, we have been learning about shapes, especially circles and triangles. We have been sorting shapes, recognising their properties (corners, sides) and finding real life examples of the shapes around the school.

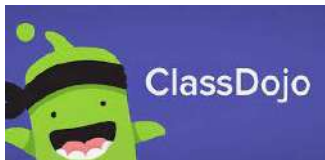
