What have we been up to this week?

Wow what an exciting week it has been in Reception! This week, the children had a brilliant time at the science dome workshop, exploring real artifacts and watching incredibly realistic animations. It was such a fantastic experience for all the children. Then we had a T Rex visit Wellington! The children were blown away by the dinosaur and were incredibly brave considering how realistic the dinosaur was. They all showed enthusiasm during the assembly, got stuck into the activities and loved having their photo taken next to the dinosaur!

In Maths we have been exploring odd and even numbers by building on from last weeks concept of sharing and grouping. The children have been collecting real objects and sharing them between two groups to investigate if the number can make two equal groups (so it is an even number) or if there is an odd one out (therefore an odd number)! In Phonics and Literacy we have been reading the story 'What the Ladybird Heard', making our own maps and using our phonic knowledge to write independently. The children have also been really passionate about writing about the dinosaurs and the butterflies. They have nearly emerged from their chrysalises.

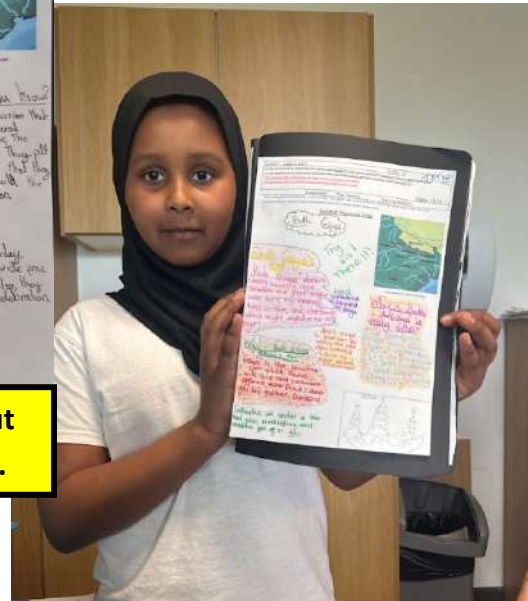
