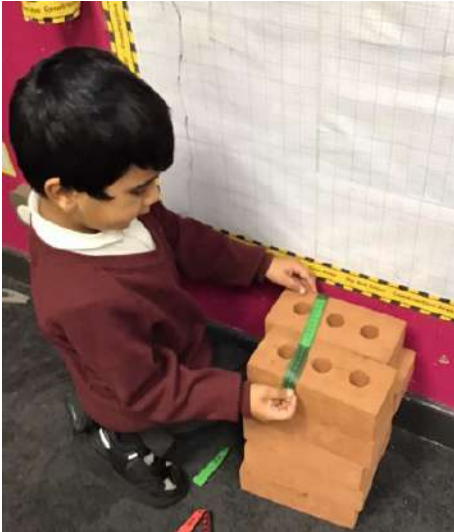

What have we been up to this week?

In phonics, we have been learning the new letter sounds 'e', 'u', 'r'. The children have enjoyed blending to read words with these sounds. They have loved listening to the Monster phonics song all about getting a pet and painting pets they would like themselves.

The children have been developing their fine motor skills whilst playing with playdough, using tweezers to lift pom poms and letters. They have been practising correct letter formation in trays of glitter and salt.

In Maths this week we have been looking at subitising and asking questions like "What do you see?"

"How do you know?" "How many are there in each group?" "What can you show me?" "What can you see?"
