What have we been up to this week?

This week, was National Science Week and the children had lots of fun dressing up as scientists on Monday. Thank you so much for all the hard work you put into their wonderful costumes, the children and staff really appreciated all your contributions. We had lots of fun learning about 'what makes a good scientist', 'what jobs scientists do' and carrying out our own investigations and experiments. We explored colour mixing, used a range of test tubes, created our own potions and watched flowers turn blue in an experiment.

In Phonics, we have been learning the 'air' sound for Tricky Witch in words like hair, chair, fair and lair. We have linked this to the story Rapunzel by describing her hair using adjectives. The children have practiced extending their sentences using connectives like 'and', 'but' and 'so'.

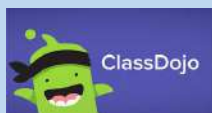
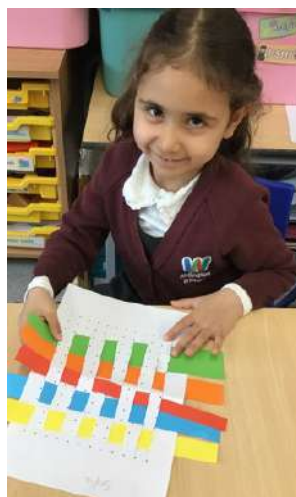

In Maths this week, we explored measurement in millilitres and litres by comparing amounts of liquid in a jug. The children were able to accurately measure amounts in their jugs and compare these amounts.

In English, we have been describing a forest setting and a giant based on our class text 'Conor the Brave' using expanded noun phrases and similes. The children extended their learning by including some metaphors and personification in their descriptions!

In Art, we have been designing our own Egyptian scrolls with drawings of beetles, cats and hieroglyphics using pencils, crayons, charcoal and pastels.

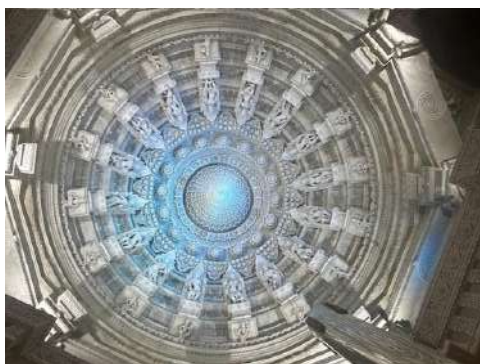

In English, we wrote Anglo-Saxon legends, up-levelling them with figurative language and action words. We planned using a box-up, added excitement with direct speech and powerful imagery, depicted the aftermath and hero's arrival, and enjoyed writing intense battle scenes. In Maths this week, we learned to add fractions and mixed numbers, subtract fractions using denominators, subtract fractions from whole numbers, and subtract fractions from mixed numbers. It was a whirlwind of fraction fun!

In RE, we explored the Golden Rule across religions, which taught us to treat others as we want to be treated. This fosters empathy, kindness, and respect, promoting tolerance and understanding while highlighting the value of fairness and compassion.

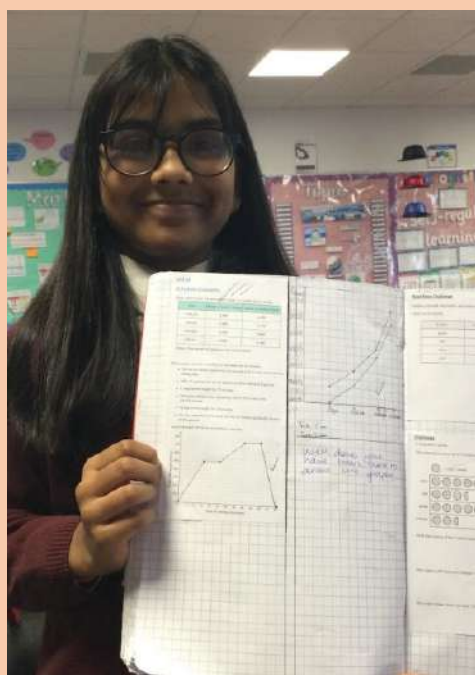
