Headteacher Message

Thank you for supporting the trip to the theatre yesterday. The children had a fantastic time watching Matilda and learning about theatre production. These opportunities really enhance the curriculum offer for the children.

We have relaunched the Bilingual Book Club and we have been very grateful to the parents who have come to these sessions and read a story in another language to our pupils. What have we been up to this week?

Our book this week was called 'Whatever Next' and was a lovely story about a bear who has a picnic on the moon. The children enjoyed role playing this story and Mia was a great Teddy bear! The children made their own jam sandwiches in class, just like the teddy in the story. They were able to use new vocabulary, e.g. 'spread' and they used the knife carefully to spread the butter and jam.

We also learned a new sound 'm' for moon and sang 'what is in my shopping bag' to find objects that began with that sound. The children were able to remember lots of the other sounds too.

In Maths the children have been talking about our self registration 5 frames and they understand that if the 5 frame is full it has 5 objects. We have been using the language of full and empty and then using this language in the water areas to help the children understand the vocabulary.

What have we been up to this week?

This week the children have continued the topic 'Once upon a time'. We have been looking at Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children enjoyed the listening to the story, exploring the characters and using story language to retell the story. The children have been learning about how to make porridge by reading, writing and exploring instructions. They absolutely loved tasting the porridge and it went down a treat! Continuing on from last week's Think Equal project on Feelings, this week we were reading the story 'The weather inside of me'. We explored the different types of weather, using a describing frame, linking it to our changing emotions. In Phonics, we have been learning the sound 'ee' for green froggy in words like 'see', 'tree', 'keep' and 'beep'. This has been linked to the story sleeping beauty where the children have been reading and writing sentences like 'she is sleeping.'

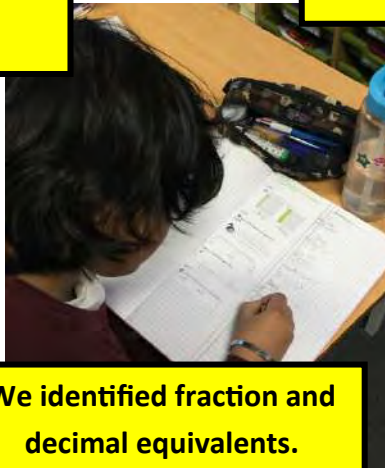

Year 6 Weekly News Friday 26th January 2024

What have we been up to this week?

In Maths this week, we have started to explore our new topic: algebra. We have used function machines, formed algebraic expressions using letters to represent numbers and found values of expressions by substituting numbers in place of the letters. In English, the children completed their narrative of the short film 'Alma'; focussing on writing including multi-clause sentences, fronted adverbials, show me not tell me and ambitious vocabulary. In P.E this week, the children created their own yoga flow showing control, balance and technique. The children focussed on moving in time with their breath and used challenging poses. In Spanish, the children explored Spanish verbs and in particular, the regular Spanish –ER verb. The children revisited how to create a verb stem from the infinitive form of the verb. They were introduced to the conjugation of a range of regular -er verbs dependent on the personal pronoun.

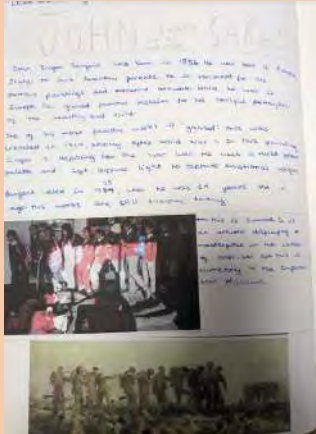

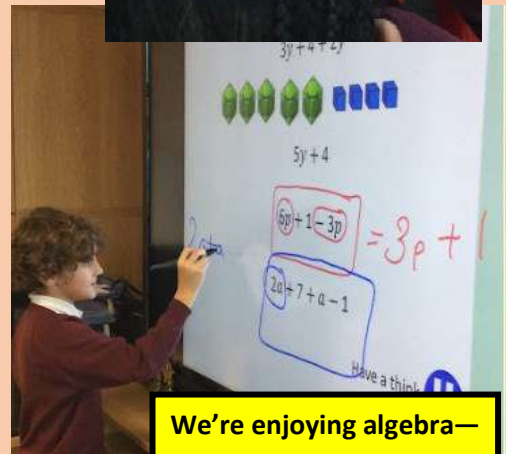
