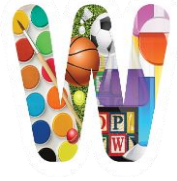

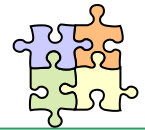

Children and staff attended the event alongside governors and organisations that work with the school, as well as volunteers and friends of the school.



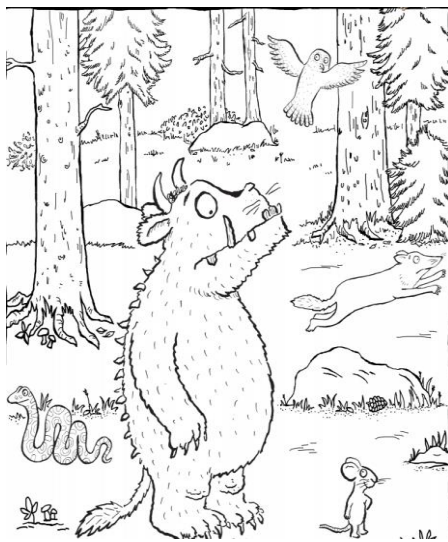
Jeremy Cherian and Hiba Alam from Year 6 read out their amazing speeches, which were written by them. There were many positive
