




There are about 75,000,000 people in the world who speak Telugu. Telugu is spoken in the state of Andhra Pradesh in India, whose capital is Hyderabad. The language is also spoken in Bahrain, Fiji, Malaysia, Mauritius, Singapore, and United Arab Emirates.

Rights Respecting

Article 2 - All children have these rights, no matter who they are, where they live, what their parents do, what language they speak, what their religion is, whether they are a boy or girl, what their culture is, whether they have a disability, whether they are rich or poor. No child should be treated unfairly on any basis.

Article 30 - You have the right to practice your own culture, language and religion - or any you choose. Minority and indigenous groups need special protection of this right

Article of the Month

Article 38 of the UNCRC- You have the right to PROTECTION from war. Children under 15 cannot be forced to go into the army.



Some facts:

Since the war started in South Sudan, UNICEF has helped 6000 children find their families again.

After all the fighting in Syria, in 2018 UNICEF helped 1.8 million children get back to school.



Remember:

- These rights apply to everybody under the age of 18.
- These rights are universal. This means they apply to all children, no matter where they live, what their religion is, if they have a disability or not, if they are a boy or a girl, whether they are rich or poor.
- These rights are unconditional. This means there is nothing you can do to have your rights taken away from you.
