


## Robocup for football playing robots




## Year 6 Production






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

# Language of the Month: Konkani

## Welcome – svaagata

Goa (गोवा) is a state in the Republic of India. It is India's smallest state. It has the second smallest number of people. The total area is 1,430 mi<sup>2</sup> (3,702 km<sup>2</sup>), It is on the west coast of India, in the region known as the Konkan. The state of Maharashtra is its neighbor to the north, and Karnataka to the east and south. There are 7.4 million native speakers.


**Article 30** - You have the right to practice your own culture, language and religion - or any you choose. Minority and indigenous groups need special protection of this right
