

Cranford Community College Sports








Rabbit-sized ' Mouse deer ' rediscovered in Vietnam after being lost to science since 1990


After being lost to science for almost three decades, this tiny deer-like species has finally been rediscovered in the forests of Vietnam. The Vietnamese mouse deer is about the size of a rabbit. Its last recorded sighting was in 1990, but after researchers managed to capture photos and video footage of the critter in the wild. It is now the first mammal to be rediscovered on the Global Wildlife Conservation's top 25 most wanted lost species in the Search for Lost Species.





