


Turtles are saved by Caretakers of a Hindu Temple

Guinness adjudicator Michael Empric, stated, "It doesn't matter what happens today with the Guinness World Records. 

Welcome – svaagata

Goa (गोवा) is a state in the Republic of India. It is India's smallest state. It has the second smallest number of people. The total area is 1,430 mi² (3,702 km²), It is on the west coast of India, in the region known as the Konkan. The state of Maharashtra is its neighbor to the north, and Karnataka to the east and south. There are 7.4 million native speakers.

Rights Respecting

Article 30 - You have the right to practice your own culture, language and religion - or any you choose. Minority and indigenous groups need special protection of this right

Article 38 of the UNCRC- You have the right to PROTECTION from war. Children under 15 cannot be forced to go into the army.

Remember:

- These rights apply to everybody under the age of 18.

- These rights are unconditional. This means there is nothing you can do to have your rights taken away from you.
