## Japanese Emperor Stepping down

83-year-old Emperor Akihito has been the first emperor in over two centuries to declare abdication, marking the end of an imperial era for Japan. He has officially stepped down at midnight just 3 days ago, being replaced with his son Naruhito, whose era will be known as the one of Peace and Harmony.



## Rare Sumatran tigers introduced in Sydney

Three Sumatran tiger cubs have been introduced to the Taronga Zoo in Sydney. These cubs- 1 male, 2 female- will help preserve the species of the endangered Sumatran tigers. 




## Rights Respecting


**Article 2** - All children have these rights, no matter who they are, where they live, what their parents do, what language they speak, what their religion is, whether they are a boy or girl, what their culture is, whether they have a disability, whether they are rich or poor. No child should be treated unfairly on any basis.

**Article 30** - You have the right to practice your own culture, language and religion - or any you choose. Minority and indigenous groups need special protection of this right

## Remember:

- These rights are unconditional. This means there is nothing you can do to have your rights taken away from you.
