Federer knocked out of US Open 2019

The five-time champion, Roger Federer, is now knocked out of the US Open 2019, after losing to Bulgaria's Grigor Dimitrov in the quarter finals on Tuesday evening. Dimitrov is quite shocked for this win, as when Federer went against him seven times before, and had won the match all of those times. In the US Open 2019 tournament, Roger Federer is ranked third, for this specific tournament, however, Dimitrov is unseeded, meaning that he is not within the top 16, for this particular tournament, so a large majority of people were surprised with this result.

There is a lot different opinions about the best way forward across the country, but it seems the Parliament and the Prime minister are having problems agreeing at the moment.




