





Where Do Polar Bears Live?

Polar bears live in the North Pole. To us the North Pole would be too cold to live. It's about -29°F during winter in the North Pole.



How Do Polar Bears Adapt?

Adaptations are things that help an animal survive in its environment. Polar bears have a layer of fat under their skin which helps them stay warm. They also have a thick layer of fur. Their wide, large paws help them to walk in the snow. It's just like wearing a pair of snow shoes. Polar bears are also excellent swimmers!



What Do Polar Bears Eat?

Polar bears are **carnivores**. A **carnivore** is an animal that only eats meat. Polar bears mostly eat seals and walrus.

What Do Polar Bears Look Like?

Polar bears can be 10 feet tall, that's the size of three first graders on top of each other. They have thick white fur and dark brown eyes.



Polar Bears and Their Cubs

Mother polar bears almost always have twins. A mother polar bear has to create a den for her cubs to keep them warm.




