

Why would someone want to live here?


What is special about this house?

Maths

Problem solving

This week we are thinking about what operation we need to use to solve problems.

The operations are addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. You will need to read the question carefully and make sure you're using the correct operation. Remember some questions may need you to use two operations to solve the problem.



For example:

Mrs Syed buys 12 pencils one week and 7 the following week. She gives 3 pencils to Miss Stange how many pencils does she have left?

Step 1: $12 + 7 = 19$

Step 2: $19 - 3 = 16$

Mrs Syed has 16 pencils left.


Task:

1. Miss Evans has 23 marbles, she loses 6 on the way home. Her mum gives her 9 more how many marbles does she have now?
2. Miss Bhamra has 6 packets of biscuits each packet has 5 biscuits. How many biscuits does she have altogether?
3. Mrs Laci has 24 apples. She shares them between 2 children. How many apples do they have each?
4. In a school kitchen, the cook has 20 pie trays. She makes meat pies and vegetarian pies. The cook uses 8 trays for the meat pies and 7 for the vegetarian pies. How many trays are used?
5. A teacher collects a bag of 28 balls for a PE lesson. There are 3 colours of ball. There are 13 blue balls and 8 green balls. How many red balls are there?
6. A photographer takes 8 photos a day. How many photographs does he take in 5 days?
7. Miss Strange goes shopping to buy her family some presents. She has £20. She spends £7.50

on her mother and £5.25 on her father. How much money does she have left?



Sam turns over two of the cards.




Which two cards has Sam turned over?

What pillar of Islam is Ramadan?


What do muslims do during Ramadan? (How many times do they pray? What is their holy book called? What bad habits do you think a muslim child gives up?)

Jam Tarts



Use this recipe to practise measuring.
Ask an adult to help you.

Makes 12 Jam Tarts.

1. Measure out:



110 g

plain flour



1 cup

jam



¼ cup

water



55 g

cooking margarine
(softened)



55 g

vegetable fat / lard
(softened)




Mix in a bowl to
make a dough.



2. Wrap in cling film. Put in the fridge for 30 minutes.

3. Roll the pastry very flat. Cut out circles.



4. Lay the circles in a muffin tin. Spoon in the jam. Ask an adult to bake them at 180°C for 20 minutes until lightly golden brown.


