


You need to make an information poster (Explanation text) showing your own research on a significant river of the world!

Some suggestions could be: The River Nile, The River Amazon, The Congo, The Thames, The Mississippi River, The River Ganges.

Your poster needs to have all the right features for an information poster:



<b>Explanation Texts</b>	
<b>Features</b>	
Text boxes	
Technical vocabulary	
Introduction – setting the scene (e.g. start with the introducing the topic and then your choice of river)	
Suits the intended audience (fonts/language – design/layout - illustrations)	
Bullet points/numbering?	
Headings/subheadings	
Can include FACTS boxes (Did you know...?)	
Diagrams and pictures (labelled)	
Cause and effect words (e.g. due to..., because, so that...)	
Time words? <b>(sometimes used)</b>	
Includes mainly action verbs, e.g. <b>catching, blowing, drilling, cutting – cuts, tears, grinds</b>	
Simple conclusion/closing statement (e.g. ‘Rivers are constantly changing and as you can see are used by different animals and humans in many different ways. What other facts can you find out about different rivers?’)	

You can use books and the internet to do your research, however, you must write up what you have learned in your own words. **DO NOT CUT AND PASTE!**

Think about different ‘topics’ that could be discussed about your chosen river:

- Where is it in the world?
- How long is it? How wide and deep?
- Does it have any particular use?
- Where does it start (the source) and which countries or places does it flow through?
- Which sea or ocean does it flow into (at the mouth)?
- What animals live in or on it?

**We will be using this writing as part of your assessment in writing, so do your best independent work.**

**You can do this on a large sheet and hand in a photo, or do a Google Slide document - like a POWERPOINT. If you do it in Google Docs, make sure you use several pages with great information and any necessary pictures or diagrams. REMEMBER A LARGE FONT SIZE DOES NOT MEAN YOU HAVE DONE A LOT OF WORK!**
