## Our Acceptable Use Policy is intended to ensure:

- that school ICT systems and users are protected from accidental or deliberate misuse that could put the security of the systems and users at risk.
- The school will try to ensure that students will have good access to ICT to enhance their learning and will, in return, expect the students to agree to be responsible users.
