<p>Use some of their print and letter knowledge to label a picture.</p>	<p>This week we will be focusing on counting one objects for each number name. Children often start off carefully and then rush.</p>	<p>Talk about the life cycle of the caterpillar. Talk to the children about stages and what happens.</p>

<p>Listening for the number of syllables in a word. Clapping the number of syllables in a word, will in turn help the children to tune in to hear the sounds when they are learning to blend for reading</p> <p>e.g. well – ing – ton = 3 syllables</p>

Ask them to listen carefully. Adults say a sound and ask the children to tip toe if they can see the sound and wait.
