Literacy

We will be reading rhyming poems and singing nursery rhymes at snack and story time and talking to the children about rhyme. We will be asking the children to think of their own rhyming words.

Maths

We will be celcrating Number day on Friday 2nd February and looking at invite the children to come in dressed with numbers on them.



We will be looking at numbers in the environment and asking the chidlren to notice them when they are out walking with their parents.

Topic/UTW/EADD

Continuing the work on bedtime routines we will be talking the children about the importance of brushing their teeth.

Talk to the children about the Dentist and who a dentist is. Talk about how sugary foods can be bad for teeth and important to brush teeth after breakfast and before bed.



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We will be recapping on the sounds that we have been learning so far satpinm and introducing the children to the new sound 'd' Show the children a selection of objects and pictures that begin with d and see if they can hear the sound at the beginning of each word, include some with the end sound. 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| Session 1 | Read the story Owl babies with the children and talk about how the Owls feeling. Talk about why they are awake at night and use the vocabulary nocturnal with the other children. Link to other animals they know are nocturnal. Talk about why the mum had left them and that she hunts for food at night. Link to jobs that people do at night. Ask children if any of their parents work at night and maybe | Sing some nursery rhymes and read the children some rhyming poems. Talk about rhyme and how some words sound the same. Give examples e.g. frog and log. Can the children think of any other things that rhyme with log and frog. Read some rhyming poems and ask the children to listen to them and say the words that rhyme. | Phonics - Recap on all the phonics that we have taught satpinm and split the children in to groups. Group 1 look at the sounds and beginning to blend Group 2 with TA on carpet, recapping and becoming familiar with the new sound d and the ones previously taught satpin. | Cornerstones - Talk to the children about the importance of brushing their teeth at night and in the morning. Make large play teeth by cutting off the bottoms of two litre plastic bottles and spraying or painting them white. Add bits of play dough to the 'teeth' and explain that sugary sweets and treats can sometimes stick to our teeth, which is why it is so important to clean them. 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
