## Message from the Headteacher

### Hot Weather Forecast and class changes for Monday

On Monday and Tuesday, the temperatures are expected to be 37 & 38 degrees. The junior school has air conditioning in all the classrooms. Many infant classrooms have air conditioning. Therefore, we have made the following changes to keep the children and staff as cool as possible.

Year 2 will spend the day in their new Yr3 junior classes with their current teachers and Year 3 will be in the AC classrooms upstairs in the juniors with their current teachers. Please bring **Year 2 children to the junior school and collect from the junior school on Monday.**

**Nursery and Reception will be closed to pupils on Monday.**

Year 1 will then be able to move children into the year 2 classrooms and the larger building spaces and use the cool adobe. Please bring year 1 to their normal classrooms at the beginning and collect from the usual place at the end of the day.

**All children to come to school in their own cooler summer clothes and shoes** and also bring water bottles and hats. Year 6 to come to school in uniform for the leavers photos and then change into cooler clothes afterwards.

The school closes on Tuesday after lunch for the summer holidays. If your child struggles in hot weather or has medical needs, please contact the school office and keep them at home.





This week we have been making our own information books. Our books were all about animals in Africa and were full of all the facts we have been learning lately!











## Maths

This week we have been using a written method to add and subtract two 2 digit numbers. We also partitioned two digit numbers.





Children were able to use the correct place value to solve all the given sums and they also attempted some tricky challenges.



## English








## RE


## English



In English this week, children have been analysing the differences and similarities between two versions of Cinderella. They explored how the characters, setting and plot differ and the reasons why they do so. They worked in larger groups to discuss and identify these main differences and similarities, debating whether Cinderella was the same character in both versions. This week they have also been learning to identify and use a wider range of subordinating and coordinating conjunctions to develop and extend their ideas. This week, they also edited and uplevelled their hot tasks, making improvements to add in further features of a balanced argument.



## Maths

In maths this week the children have continued to work extremely hard in their maths lessons looking at geometry. This week we have been looking at identifying acute, obtuse, right and reflex angles. It is clear the children have developed their problem solving skills over the last academic year as they were able to read degrees on a reflex angle by looking at part whole models. The children have learnt how to use a protractor which they really enjoyed. We then went on to drawing our own angles and lines accurately. I am sure they can't wait to develop these skills next year in year 6!
