
India Republic Day





India sends the lightest satellite in space.

Last Friday, India sent the lightest satellite in the world into space. Weighing only 2.6lb (1.26kg), and named Klamatsat V-2, it was made by students and belongs to a space education firm. It will help radio operators and is hoped to inspire children to become the scientists and engineers of the future. The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) launched it from its Sriharikota space centre.






New footbridge for Chiswick




