Beautiful cherry trees bloom in Japan

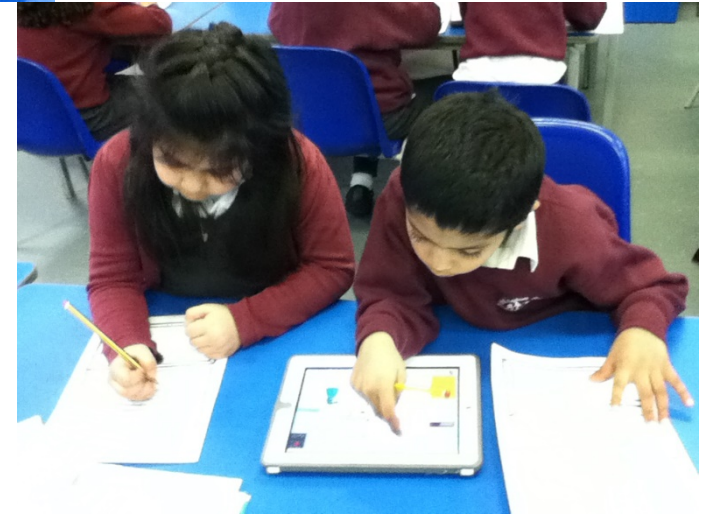
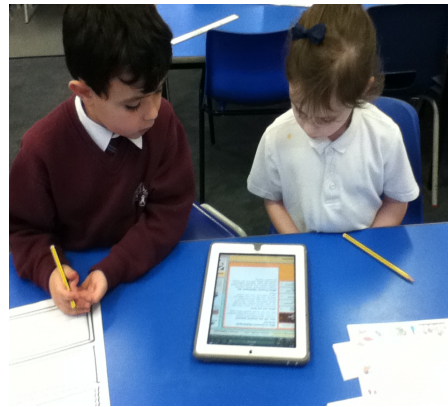
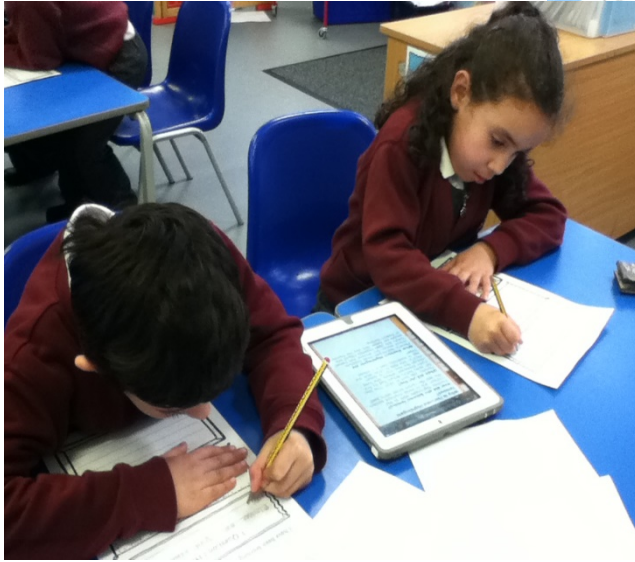
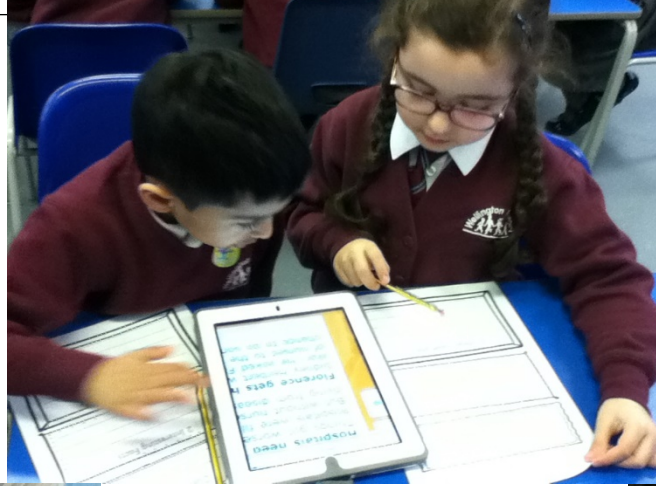

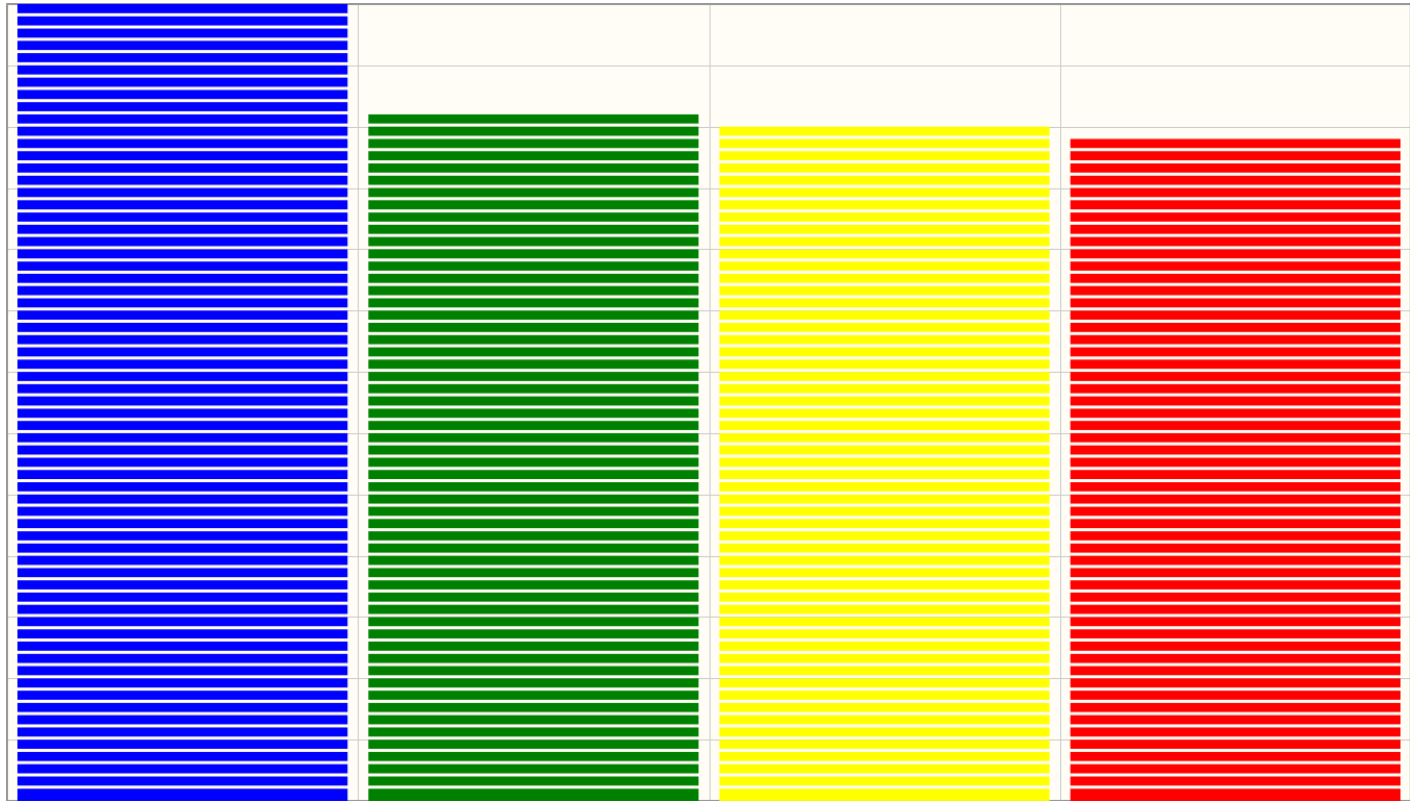
Reading to help children in hospital
