### Cave rescue: 12 Thai boys out

Twelve boys and their football coach have been rescued after being trapped in a flooded cave in Thailand for more than two weeks. The last four youngsters and their coach - all members of the Wild Boars football team - were brought to safety on Tuesday. The Thai Navy Seals, who have been running the rescue mission, posted on social media: "Twelve wild boars and coach out of the cave. Everyone safe." The group entered the cave in the north of the country on 23 June but were trapped after heavy rains blocked their route out.



### Cristiano Ronaldo joining Juventus in €100m deal from Real Madrid

Cristiano Ronaldo is joining Juventus after the Italian club agreed a €100m (£88.3m) fee for the Portugal forward with Real Madrid. The 33-year-old is ready for a new challenge after nine years at Real Madrid and asked the La Liga club to let him go. Ronaldo is signing a four-year contract with an annual salary of around €30m. "I only have feelings of enormous gratitude for this club and for this city," Said Ronaldo


### R.A.F 100th anniversary

At lunchtime on Tuesday, the Royal Air Force (RAF) staged a spectacular flypast over London as part of its 100th birthday celebrations. Thousands of people gathered on the Mall outside Buckingham Palace, while the Queen and other members of the Royal Family watched the flypast from the palace balcony. The show involved over 100 aircraft, making it the largest number of military jets over London in recent times. There have been lots of events so far this year to mark the fact that the RAF was created 100 years ago on 1 April 1918. Also, most of us watched the planes fly over Wellington!

Prince Louis, who is fifth in line to the throne, has been christened in London. He arrived alongside his family at St James's Palace wearing the same gown his siblings wore to their christenings. It's the first time the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and their three children have been seen together as a family of five. Though the Queen and her husband, the Duke of Edinburgh were not able to attend the christening. Harry and Meghan the newly wedded couple were also there.







No child should be treated unfairly on any basis.

**Article 30** - You have the right to practice your own culture, language and religion - or any you choose. Minority and indigenous groups need special protection of this right

- Favourite picture books


