
## World news

### Cat mummies and scarabs discovered in Egypt

Last Saturday a glut of mummified cats and scarabs were uncovered in 7 tombs. They were found in Sakkara and are approximately 6000 years old! The mission had started in April 2018 and after 7 months, they have struck success. The animals lie in three of them and the other four hold mummies. One of the discoveries is the tomb of Khufu-Imhat the overseer of buildings in the royal palace. A statue made from bronze -honoring the cat goddess, Bastet- stood out amongst the hundred wood gilded cat mummies.

### Bitcoin tumbles to its lowest level in one year

The world's largest cryptocurrency touched a low of \$5,322 (£4271) a coin, its weakest since October 2017 and because of this other crypto rivals like Ethereum, Ripple, Litecoin, etc. have fallen sharply by at least 10%! This is the highest value of money bitcoin has ever lost in just one year, which is disastrous.




If you could visit any place where would it be and why?
