The 19th century mansion once owned by the Rothschild family will be seen in all its glory once again on Saturday when **Gunnersbury Museum reopens to the public.**

Following a huge multi-million pound regeneration project at the mansion's museum and grounds, there will be a packed weekend of family activities to celebrate on Saturday (June 23) and Sunday (June 24). The once-neglected museum has been transformed and boasts new gallery and learning spaces, as well as a brand new exhibit telling the stories of **Ealing**, **Hounslow** and local people.

The years had taken their toll on the house but the grand design by fashionable 19th century architect Sydney Smirke has been restored, bringing to life the once opulent home of the Rothschild family




## Year 2 Making seagulls


## Chicks




# Language of the Month: Mandarin





# WELLI FEST 2018



Three White Badges = One Team Badge




Three Team Badges = One Gold Badge
